Directions -

From South Shore/Cape Cod:

Follow Rt. 3 North. Take exit 17 and follow the rotary. Take your third exit off the rotary (South Braintree). Continue straight through the traffic light, up the hill, and turn left at the next light onto Washington St. At the next intersection, traffic light turn right onto Central Ave. At the end of the road, turn left onto Rt. 37 South. Follow Rt. 37 South until you see a white church on your right, which marks the entrance to Pond St. Turn right onto Pond St. The hospital is located 1/2 mile ahead on your left.

From Boston:

Follow Rt. 93 South (also known as the Southeast Expressway). At the Rt. 93 & Rt. 3 split, bear right toward Dedham (do not bear left toward Braintree). Take exit 6 toward Rt. 37 South. Stay on Rt. 37 South until you see a large white church on your right. Turn right onto Pond St. The hospital is located 1/2 mile ahead on your left.
